

MINUTES
OF THE
ORANGEBURG BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

PLEASANT HILL BAPTIST CHURCH,
ORANGEBURG Co., S. C., FRIDAY, OCTOBER 15, 1880.

The Association was called to order by Elder W. G. Mack, the Moderator, by singing the hymn, "Stand up, my soul," and prayer by Rev. E. H. Graves.

The letters from the churches were then called for, and read by Brethren J. H. Felder and John R. Mack.

During the reading of the letters, the Clerk minuted the state of the churches, and enrolled the delegates as follows:

The roll of delegates was then called, and the above named were present.

An election was then entered into by ballot for Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer. Brethren B. H. Knotts, J. R. Fulmer and J. H. Feller were appointed Tellers to receive and count the votes for officers. They reported the following officers elected: Rev. W. G. Mack, Moderator; B. Williamson, Clerk; and E. Rickenbacker, Treasurer.

The Moderator, in a few appropriate remarks, exhorted the brethren to stand by the Constitution, and asked for counsel.

The following preamble and resolution was offered by Rev. E. H. Graves, and adopted:

After hearing of the great work being done by the union of the first division of the Association—

Resolved, That we advise the second division to organize at once.

Bro. J. H. Felder offered the following resolution, which was adopted—

Inasmuch as a greater need of missionary work is apparent everywhere—

Resolved, That we ask our members connected with the churches of this Association to contribute five cents a month for this purpose, and send up to each Association.

On motion, Rev. I. D. Pickett was received as a representative of the Missionary Union of the First Division of the Orangeburg Baptist Association.

On motion—

Resolved, That hereafter the Clerks of the churches be requested to ascertain the amounts contributed during the Associational year by the church or any member, for all benevolent purposes, and report the same to the Association annually in their letters.

Report of Committee on Digest of Letters.
