EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH.

FRIDAY, OCT. 14TH, 1892.

The Association convened as appointed with the Ebenezer Baptist church on Friday, October 14th, 1892, at 11 A.M., and was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. S. B. Sawyer. A song was sung, a psalm was read and prayer offered by Rev. J. S. Hayden.

On motion, S. B. Sawyer and T. F. Rivers were appointed to visit Bethel church, relative to its continued absence from meetings of this body.

The treasurer read his annual report, which was referred to proper committee for examination.

W. C. McCall read report on Home Missions, and on motion to adopt, supplemented his report by a stirring speech. Report adopted.

Report on State Missions was presented by T. F. Rivers. He also spoke to the report very vigorously. Dr. Bailey, of State Mission Board, followed with a very earnest speech. A collection for State Missions was taken, amounting in cash to \$7925 and \$5 in pledges.

By motion, report on Foreign Missions was made the special order for 2 p.m., and Education special order for 3 p.m. At 12:30 the Association receded from business to the grove, from labor to refreshment, till 2 p.m.

AFTERNOON SESSION

After recess, the Association reassembled, with song, "Jesus, refuge of my soul."

The Moderator announced a continuation of the Standing Committee on Orphanage, with addition of D. H. Crosland, also, of Executive Board, with A. M. Board in place of F. J. Park, and W. R. E. Bonnett added.

The Committee on Nominations submitted the following report, which was adopted:

J. H. Sanford read report on Foreign Missions, following his report with an excellent talk. It was also discussed by B. M. Foreman. Report adopted.

10 A. M. Sunday was fixed for Sunday School report.

The special order for 3 p.m. was taken up, viz.: Report on Education, read by W. C. McCall. Report was discussed by W. C. McCall, especially on the line of an Associational School. Prof. F. N. K. Bailey, of the Williston High School, and Dr. T. M. Bailey made a few pertinent remarks. The following subscriptions, to be paid during next associational year for associational school, were made:

W. C. McCall, \$100; T. E. Rickenbaker, \$100; D. H. Crosland, \$25; Geo. E. Bolen, \$23; B. M. Foreman, \$25; W. R. R. Bonnett, \$10; R. H. Riley, N. C. Syrett and J. M. Antley, \$50; Mrs. J. P. Smoak, \$5. Total, \$340. An offer was made from Norway of 25 acres of land and \$600. Report was adopted by a rising vote.

By motion, fifteen instead of thirteen Trustees were elected for the High Schools, as follows: T. E. Rickenbaker, I. P. Smoak, W. C. McCall, D. H. Crosland, W. A. McIver, M. L. Harlong, J. M. Riley, B. M. Foreman, R. H. Riley, J. H. Sanford, J. H. Felder, W. L. Zeigler, Dr. M. S. Gressett, S. P. Sawyer and D. M. Westberry.

Resolved, That these Trustees have power to charter, invite offers, locate and do anything relative to establishing their school.

Geo. E. Bolen reported for Committee on Temperance. Discussed by G. E. Bolen, W. C. McCall, J. H. Sanford, Dr. Bailey and D. H. Crosland. Adopted.

Report on Obituaries was read by B. M. Foreman and adopted.
