MINUTES.

LEWISVILLE BAPTIST CHURCH.

ORANGEBURG COUNTY, S. C., OCT. 15TH, 1886.

The Moderator, Rev. S. B. Sawyer, convened the Association by singing the 641st hymn, reading the 24th Psalm, and the Association was led in prayer by Rev. J. S. Hayden.

The Clerk, Rev. T. Wm. T. Nolen, being absent, Bro. W. B. Mack was appointed Clerk until the organization.

Letters from the churches were then called for, and read by Rev. T. M. Galphin and Bro. T. E. Rickenbaker. During the reading of the letters the Clerk enrolled the delegates as follows:

An election being entered into by ballot, brethren T. E. Rickenbaker, Wm. Paulin and A. B. Smoak were appointed tellers, to receive and count the votes.

On motion, the Association adjourned to convene again to-morrow at 10 o'clock A. M. Prayer by Rev. E. H. Graves.

SATURDAY—10 A. M.

The Association was called to order, by singing "Our souls by love together knit," reading the 133rd Psalm and prayer by Bro. G. E. Bolin.

On motion, Bro. T. H. Heap was received as a delegate from Congaree Church.

After roll call, reading and confirmation of the minutes, proceeded to appoint messengers to sister Associations.

Received and adopted Report on Finance.

Report on Foreign Missions.

We have missions in China, Africa, Italy, Brazil and Mexico. These missions are greatly in need of men and money. It is our duty to supply this need. For without the gospel these people must perish. And our Lord commands us to preach the gospel to every creature. We recognize the fact that we have fallen far short of our duty in this matter, and by God's grace we are determined to do better in the future. Therefore, be it

Resolved, 1. That all the churches composing this Association be requested to set apart the 7th day of November as a day of special prayer and contribution for missions.

2. That the 7th of November be set apart as a "children's day," to be

observed in all of the Sunday schools in this Association, and contributions be received for missions.

The Association was called to order by singing "Blest is the man whose soothing hand," &c., reading 91st Psalm and prayer by Rev. I. D. Bricket. After roll call, reading and confirmation of the minutes, proceeded to business.

On motion, the Association passed a vote of thanks to the brethren of Lewisville and community for their generous hospitality.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Association are hereby tendered to the Methodists for the kind offer of their pulpit to the Association on Sunday.

The Chair announced the Executive Board as follows: B. Williamson, President; W. B. Mack, A. B. Smoak, W. R. E. Bountit, J. E. North, J. R. Fulmer, with the Treasurer of the Association. Confirmed.

Resolved, that the money collected after the missionary sermon be turned over (after paying expenses) to the State Mission Board.

On motion, the Treasurer was instructed to pay the Clerk \$10 for his services.

Dr. Bailey made an appeal to the Association and congregation for help for the Baptist churches in Charleston, and a collection was taken amounting to \$17.55.

On motion, each delegate is requested to bring before their church the needs of the churches in Charleston and take up collections for the same and forward to its destination.

On motion, adjourned to hear the charity sermon, which was preached by Dr. Bailey from Acts x: 38, at the close of which a collection was taken amounting to \$16.78.
